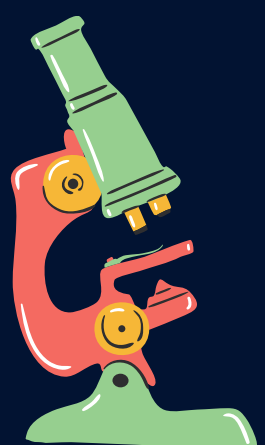
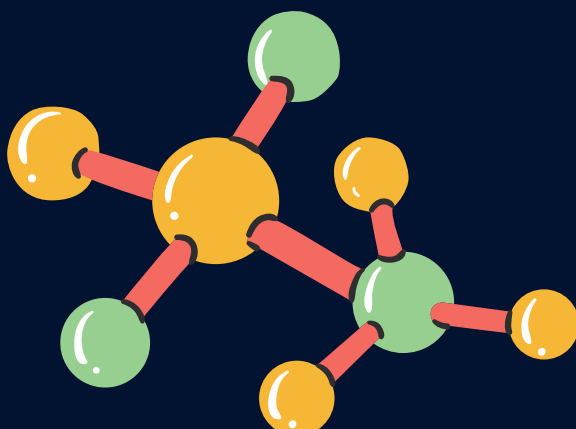
Dear Students

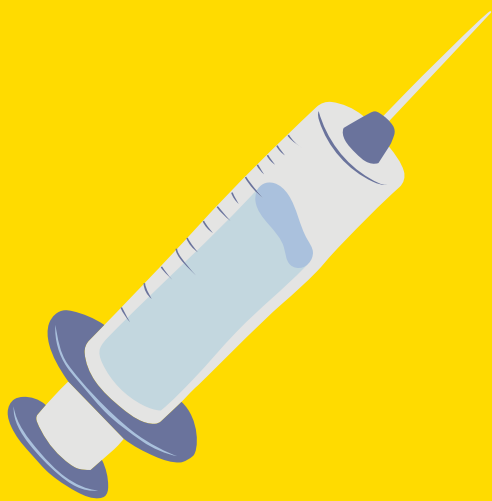

Hence we encourage students to vaccinate.

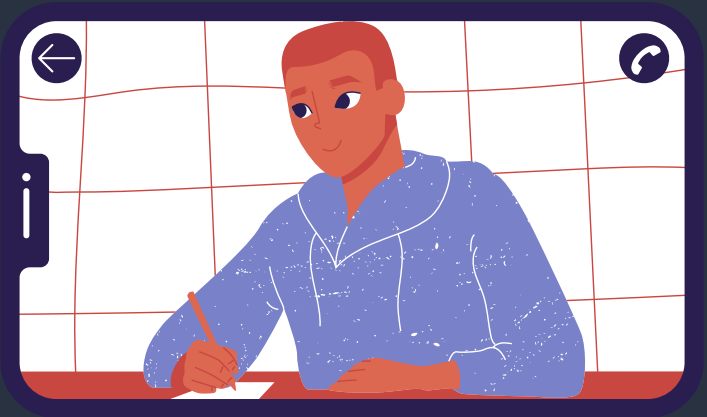

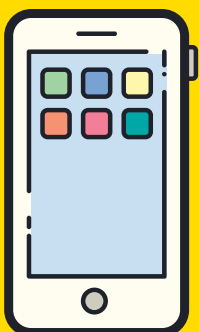
